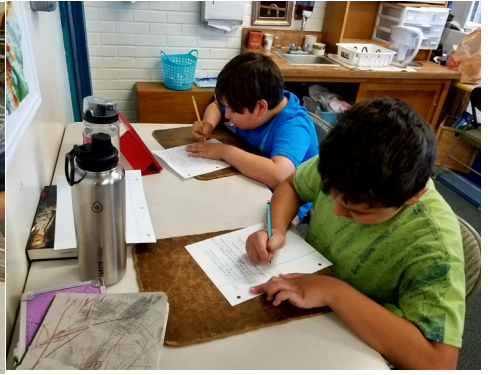

Meher families ... happy –soon to be– summer! We have reached the final chapter of the 2018 school year! Our school-wide standardized testing concluded; the Middle School's first seedlings, cultivars of the Cucurbita pepo (otherwise known as pumpkin) planted; students H₂Go cart sales at the elementary school finished for the year; and, lastly, we had the end of the year music performance. So, just a few closing remarks before we part for the summer.



Creating a living, breathing soil

Masayo from Shumei paid her monthly visit to the Middle School to help transform a section of long neglected and desiccated soil into a biologically active micro-biome that will support a thriving vegetable and herb garden for years to come.

Under Masayo's direction, students, with the help of Alex Chagoya, thrust shovels and swung garden picks into the dry, clumped soil to loosen

it, enabling them to amend it with mulch and plant their seedlings. Some students chose to plant barefoot, giving them the opportunity to work, play, and learn in the wet soil, muddied by watering of the crusted soil.

Micro Economics Class- Business Principles with an Entrepreneur

Below is an end-of-the-year word from the Micro-economy teacher, Ms. Espinoza ...

As the year comes to a close, it is exciting to see the results the students have accomplished this year. You may have noticed the students' cart, "H₂Go"- which was a revamped version of last year's Meher Cart. There were many business concepts that the students discussed behind the scenes before the sale of fresh waters took place on Thursdays. The students discussed such topics as teamwork, leadership, preparation, planning, goals and results, and accountability to name a few. Even though it may seem like they were just selling water, students learned many lessons by running the cart.

The last few weeks centered on money. What an interesting topic this has been! I was particularly excited about opening the students' minds to what money really is, and how they relate to it. Additionally, they were asked to journal about their perceptions of money, how much they save, and what the sources of their money are. It was interesting to see how statements such as, "I don't have any money," quickly changed

once a student saw just how much they actually do have. After a month of observation, each student chose a money topic to write about. Have you thought about your relationship with money?

A year-end musical performance

Having practiced reading music and playing their instruments, the students will be performing a year-end concert of the pieces they have been working on for the younger students at the elementary school. Ms. Holmes has shared with me how impressed she's been with the students' progress in reading music and playing their instruments.

A graduates parting note

Recently, the students were given the assignment to write a short essay, a travel piece of sorts that called on the students to find their own path in the essay. Being the tech hound that he is, Michael chose NVIDIA (en-vid-ee- uh), a kind of Intel of graphic cards, as his destination. I found it interesting that Michael's essay mentions his older brother, a high school student at the time, with a title that will shortly describe Michael. In Michael's words ...

I have a passion for computers, or what may be called an obsession. It started while watching my brother build his computer when he was in high school. I followed his hands closely as he snapped, fastened, and tightened components together; I was hooked on computers and technology.



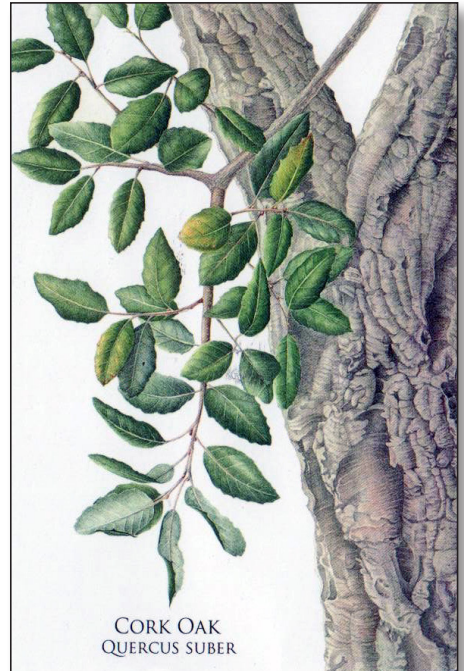

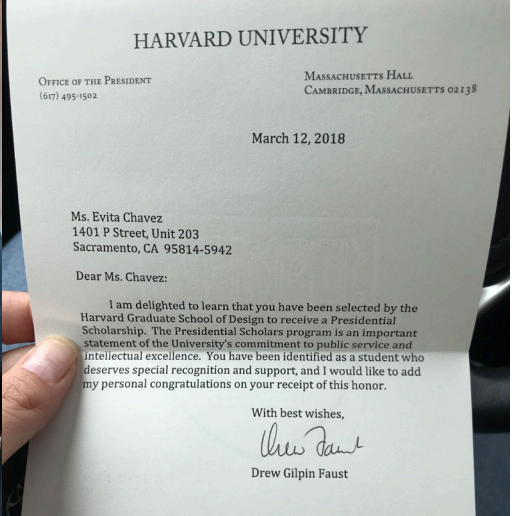
